

# Psalm 106

1 Chronicles 16:8–36

Matthew 19:16–17

## Connections with Psalm 105:

1. They, as with 103 and 104, begin and end with \_\_\_\_\_ and thanksgiving to Yahweh.
2. They, with 104, are part of the first \_\_\_\_\_ of Hallelu-YAH psalms.
3. They, with 96, quote portions of David's psalm recorded in 1 Chronicles \_\_\_\_\_.

- v. 3 The kind of human who is \_\_\_\_\_ by Yahweh; see Psalm 15 and Psalm 24:3–5
- vv. 4–5 Personal \_\_\_\_\_ by the psalmist
- vv. 6–43 Recounting of \_\_\_\_\_'s behavior and \_\_\_\_\_'s dealings with them  
vv. 6–12 In \_\_\_\_\_  
vv. 13–33 In the \_\_\_\_\_  
vv. 34–43 In \_\_\_\_\_
- vv. 44–46 Recounting Yahweh's \_\_\_\_\_ love and faithfulness
- vv. 47–48 Remainder of quotation from 1 Chronicles 16:34–36

**The conclusion of the psalm (vv. 47–48) prepares for the themes of \_\_\_\_\_ from exile that will emerge in Book V, the climax of the Book of Psalms.**

- v. 47 Prayer of the \_\_\_\_\_ based on Yahweh's covenantal love and faithfulness
- v. 48 Praise to Yahweh
